The Wisconsin Society of Pharmacy Students (WSPS) works very closely with the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin (PSW). Many WSPS members attend both of the Conferences hosted by PSW. This allows students to interact with PSW members and build connections that allow for further participation within the organization.

For example, one of the fourth-year student rotation sites is hosted at the headquarters of PSW. Students therefore have the opportunity to see how the state organization functions and students will often carry out their involvement with this organization long after they graduate.

All students are also given the opportunity to submit articles to the Journal of the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin (JPSW). This past year, current students, in addition to pre-School of Pharmacy Students were given the opportunity to publish articles on a wide range of topics.
